1969. Marcos was "re-elected" president. after he spent millions dollars win support and crush political dissent. The plunged country was into chaos. Inflation soared, the money (Peso) lost 60 percent in value and there were major food shortages. Marcos tried "reform" through the Constitutional Convention, but this was rejected. Fighting increased on the. streets. with every demonstration ending deaths. with In the countryside, the army had to deal with the National People's Army (NPA), the military wing of the Maoist Communist Party of the Phillipines.

In the mid 1970s the Army, the navy and the air force were doubled from 31,000 to 78,000 and the para-military Philippines Constabulary grew from 23,000 to 35,000.

In four years detence spending leapt from \$92 million to \$410 million and real wages dropped 30 percent.
