

DIED IN THE STRUGGLE:

Ahmed Timol - a 30 year old Roodepoort teacher alleged to have committed suicide, fell from the 10th floor of John Vorster Square Police headquarters whilst under interrogation. Amidst country-wide protests, Brigadier Pienaar deputy head of the Security Police said 'Timol was a 'hero' of the Communists'.

Mthuli kaShezi - B.P.C. Vice President of the Interim Committee and SASO's Black Workers Project Field Worker, who before dying alleged that he was pushed on to an on-coming train by a white railway worker. Died a week after sustaining serious injuries. Shezi quarrelled with a white official who was pushing blacks around on the platform and for this he paid with his life. He died on the 77th December, 1972.

N. Gaga - died 7th May, 1965,

P. Hoyo - died 8th May, 1965,

O.R. Tiro, - died on the 1st of February, 1974, he was killed by a parcel bomb allegedly posted in Geneva. However, subsequent investigations indicate that the source is not far from Botswana.

Tiro was SRC president of the University of the North, in 1974 when he was expelled for pointing out the inadequacies inherent in the Dantu Education System. In 1973, when our brothers were banned, he joined the SASO executive as Perm. Organiser. At the time of his death he was the President of SASM (South African Students' Movement.)

CHANGE IN SOUTH AFRICA

Neither the lessons of history nor the law of averages are going to effect any change in our sad racist situation. If change must come it has to be through our own doing. Oppressors have never been in the habit of handing out freedom to a subjugated people, especially in the form of a 'seperate stan'. The apparent indifference with which we view our position as an oppressed people can easily be gauged by our seeming unwariness in accepting in our midst the paid servants of the white minority government.

DIVISION OF LAND:

Although Blacks constitute about 90% of South Africa's population, only 15% of mostly barren land (while over 115,000 Black

Listed herein below are names of Black Leaders who have been silenced by the Minister of Justice Petrus Cornelius Pelser and his agents in terms of the 'Suppression of Communism Act'. They have been banned because of their opposition to the unjust laws of this country and their willingness to sacrifice their lives in the name of the Black struggle.

They are:

1. Steve Biko: first President of SASO. Restricted to Kingwilliams Town.
2. Saths Cooper- P.R.O. of the B.P.C., restricted to Durban.
3. Drake Koka - founder members of B.P.C. and 1st Secretary General - restricted to Johannesburg.
4. Bokwe Mafuna - field officer of Black Workers Project - restricted to Johannesburg.
5. Jerry Modisane - President of SASO from June 1972 until he was banned in March, 1973. - restricted to Kimberley
6. Strini Moodley - President of SABTU and full time employee of SASO - restricted to Durban.

7. Randwezi Nengwekhulu - Permanent Organiser of SASO. - restricted to Sibasa. He has since left the country for Botswana.
8. Barney Pityana- Secretary General of SASO and former President. -restricted to P.E.
9. Mervyn Jossie - Administrative Assistant of SASO, - restricted to Durban.
10. Ben Khoapa - Director of Black Community Programmes - restricted to Umlazi.
11. Jeffrey Baqwa, Literacy Director SASO - restricted to Umzimkhulu.
12. Henry Isaacs - President of SASO - restricted to Pietermaritzburg.
13. Siphon Buthelezi - Secretary-General B.P.C. restricted to Newcastle.
14. Chris Mokoditso - Vice-President BPC restricted to Johannesburg.
