Steven Sihewula was the applicant Er Kotze was then Minister of Bantu Administration & Development.

Letter to Dr Fiet Koornhof, (Dept of Plural Relations)
20/03/79 - appealing to him to look more deeply into the matter because "our young children and the old are dying with hunger.

Spoke of their desire of the people to return to their "native land" "where the bones of their forefathers are."

After-int The reply by Administrative Secretary in the Department of Flural Relations & Levelopment dated 04/06/1979:

by direction of Dr F. Hartzenberg, Deputy Minister of Development, "I have to inform you that removal of residents of Black Spots is Government policy and is carried out to give effect to the consolidation of the Black States. To allow your people to return to the area from which they were removed for resettlement will, therefore, defeat consolidation aims and cannot be permitted."

Complaints in relations to pas books, permits, pensioners were local matter which would be dealt with by local magistrate.

"Feople who own or occupy property of 20 morgen or less are resettled in townships or closer settlements. In such cases provision is not made for pasturage for livestock.

If your people go back to the Mumansdorp properties which they vacated they will only cause themselves unnecessary hardships and subject themselves to prosecution, without achieving anything.

After judgement t was given in favour of the Department it was signified in writing that the people were willing to be removed from the Humansdorp areas. This is an indication that they accepted the Court's decision and no useful prupose will be served in further debating this matter at this stage." - J.K. van v.d. Linden Admin. Secretary.

Letter to the PFP this year 18/8/31 saying they "we have never heard anything tangible since then. 2 i.e. since ward told them that matter was discussed at C.T. and refer ed to the Deprt of CaD.

7/6/81 to PFP referring to removal "which was illfavoured by the residents of all the four reserves, wittekleibosch, Snyklip, Dorriskraal and Neuweplaas. "We had several meetings where this matter was discussed and was unanimously objected and declared unacceptable. We are stunned to get a letter from our Honourable Deputy Finister stating that the people signified their willingness to be removed by signing documents. All we know is that landroversy were roaming bout and people were told that if they refused they will be arrested, to prove that, some were take to custody. That has caused many to panic as we were not accustomed to go to jail, or anything of that nature.

* As people who were there for nearly 200 years, we were entitled to get letters of notification, as we get here in town when anything is going to take place.

* Crops were left to perish in the fields and stock was sold at a giveaway price; the loss was incomprehensible.
