148 apartheid laws aimed to separate people in all aspects of life on the basis of race. These laws are listed on a wall in the Apartheid Museum.

Laws like the Group Areas Act of 1950 ensured that people of different races were restricted to separate living areas based on race. Here, Africans living in Sophiatown are being removed to Meadowlands in 1956.

The pass laws restricted the freedom of movement of all Africans by limiting their movement into urban areas. Most Africans were arrested for a pass law offence at one time or another.

The Bantu Education Act of 1953 was intended to make Africans feel inferior. Africans were trained to do unskilled labour.
