The Formation School was approved by the Acting-President, Honry E. Isacce, who briefly outlined the nature and purpose of this important formation school. He exphraised the need score dalayetes for full participation in group discussions and also at planary enseigns. Heating released averyoutly he called on the Klaisechmidt to read this input page on inter-enous relations. (See Arroward)

This poper, though not comprehensive, incredup a cide scope for discussion and exploration. He mentioned communication, progressing and involvement in the exposition of inter-group relations. From this paper there cross throughout with which the groups had to died in-depth.

QUESTIONS:

- 1) How best can Black students offeet involvement in the Black Community
 - (a) Among thomselves

- (b) Botacon themselves
- (c) The Black Community as a whole.
- (2) That is the rale of Block groups an agencies in socio-political change?
- (3) Suggest in Schill the type of programmes in which Block groups should involve themselves in pursuit of the Block men's enginetions.

The various groups shalt in depth with the tests before them though plannay expressed discretion with the grups and requested that they be sent back to re-consider thair findings. Group 2 was in firebad and harmin to report on their findings and recommendations.

Question: What is the role of Black groups (or students) as Agencies in Socio-Cultural change.

The topic appeared to be too west and could be tookled from several angles. This group, therefore, selected Education, Economy and Arts as points to be looked into theroughly. To not as appearies at the first that there can be two approximate, viz.

- 1) The type of society we envisege
- 2) That liberation can be the point of departure

The considerion agreed uncontinuely that socio-cultured change should be general tearned the type of society anylanged, i.e. a socioty lessed on solf-relience in which liberation is unstrated.

Education

Education can enver be control in the same that oducation is either for liberation or demetication. In line with the emiliar definition endertion for Unrake in South Africa must be for eath-reliance. The Commission epuls out the scan for a definition of the entertional system that would result in enti-reliance. In providing a definition of oducation for this reliabilities the entertion by 3850 and improvised in the Liberary Project explains the education which is sended, i.e. education for enti-reliance.

Suggested involvements

- 1) Students and pupils to be trained as co-ordinators for literacy.
- Students qualifying at training colleges should be conscientised and encouraged to join technic associations.
- Theological students should receive the same attention as other prospective temphors.

Primary School Situation

This situation was looked at in the light of the importance of the church especially the Sanday School, situation.

The three groups were supposed to deal with all three questions in Artal. Groups referred to in succition one were existly recompany, and a solution had to be found to bridge the gap that existed in their ranks. To credite this district explanation this district explanation of solutions and on Communication. Results of social districts are rejudice and endealty energy readel groups. In this way there is mutual benefit, understanding and co-operation.

b) Economic stratification

OLACK POSER: AS A PROGRAMUE FOR LIDERATION

Dofinition:

Olook Power is a williamism of lithing power in the propio and on consequence of the people connectedly, neathly and politically. Mark Power sets as a catalyst towards change and liberation.

How can Black Power be programmed for liberation.

1) BLACK POTER & EDUCATION

The mine of the present educational system are assentially to give vocational training to Blacks who must fit into piguon-holes set up by the system.

Verious schomes need to be utilized to sensitize the people from the corrupt influences of education. This could be done by the errottion of institutions which would be controlled by relevant people. Long-term schomes like the Free University should be looked into, High School student argenisations must be put into the steture and made active in their adventional destiny.

Pricate and Sundry School trachers should try and stop up conscientization of their "pupils" the countries children and the Misch Community, Education is not necessarily clearance traching but also informal.

2) BLACK PONTR & THEOLOGY

As already continued show, priests and Sundry School to obsers can help in Corescinntization and help arks thealogy relevant to the expirations of the Shook people. Scanizars, symposin and other discussions could be organized such that the respective people grin exists benefit from participation there. SASO manhers should participate actively in church activities and must load the proplets knowing that thoulogy and likewition are constant companions. They must take notive positions in finide relating to youth work. The Slock Theology agoncy should by emphasis on libration, and must relay this message to the green-roots.

3) BLACK POTER & LACOUR

BLACK POWER: AS A DEVELOPMENT OF POLITICAL THOUGHT AMONGST OLACKS

Dofinitions

from Jones Cone: - " the complete emencipation of Clack people from white appreciain by whatever means Clack people door magaziny".

Why Block Power?

Whereas the political thought which provailed in the Clack Consumity presidualy was presented by the white men, critical bed through Clack northe resulting in complete political thought — alignation in the Clack situation, the compones of Clack Power is soon as the logical compounce of the realisation by Clack people to become faithful to the solves and their own situation, and to relate their political thoughts to their specific situations. To understand this alignation it becomes clear whom we look at the type

of society in which Bkeek people find themselves which in essence is a closed society to such an extent that all mechanisms opracting within, the super structure are contralled by the whites. In the same way the political mechanism is in the bands of whites,

Development of political thought

Deceuse of political starvation Danks were becoming disactisfied. Whites realised this and introduced a number of Bills e.g. Native hand Bill, Native Nepresentative Dill and Native Trust Bill etc. These laws were completely contrary to what they purpoted to do - they left the Black people disposed and landless. Disactisfaction resulted in the formation of Trate and Industrial Workers Union which was general to, a type of physical and not psychological liberation. Lack of political insight rendered them ineffective. After this other people beyon looking at their situation more enalytically. This resulted in ergendactions like ANC and PNC, but because of multi-recial o 'erbores or totally African image, these groups could noot bring about total liberation of the scale.

The group dealt in-depth with the greath of Direk political movements in this country. The period of development was divided into the:

- (a) pre-union ora which was acread by common resonance of Olcoks of the "non-white" franchise. Initially the different Olcok groups operated independently of the other and could not see themselves as part of a whole.
- (b) the early years of union Juring which period restrictive legislation on the Clack groups intensified, particularly on the African Section. It is during those years that the South African Native Congress (later re-nesed African National Congress) was be'n. There was a lot of activity during this ora.
- (c) period till 1948 through further legislation Africans were isolated in all respects. The signatory labour system was intensified. During this poriod means were evolved to bring about Clack Unity. Many political groups were born in this period.
- (d) 1948 -1953 Highlight of this ara was the Defiance Compaign which was a compaign against pass laws, non-franchisa tate, and a number of rists tack place then. This compain emphasised athe fact that all Glack groups core feeling the same.
- (c) 1983 1984 Re-actionery groups emerget Clocks became provident PAC was formed and banned during this period. Most of the groups were concentrating in one forms or the other on physical liberation and looked like they were ignoring psychological oppression. Another thing there was no definite philosophy to which people could look to. Many organisations were banned during this period and there ensued a period of temporary 1011.

(f) 1964 — Disillusianment with multi-recial organisations who to renging degrees wented white leadership and semination. People foll into a drop lull until in 1960 when moves towards formation of SASO. In 1960, SASO was formally launched and Black Consciousness finally adopted a philosophy. After SASO has grown numerous other argenisations on various places.

The Commission felt that us at present Cleak Power does art exist in this country. But what exist is Cleak Commissions. We need to look at definitions to understand the above assertion.

- Clock Conscirusness in a political sense is an averages by the Clack that he is appressed politically, and this recliration must lead him to his liberation.
- (ii) Block Soliderity This is gonerated by Block Consciousness, the important aspect being "belongingness" of the Block races. The Blocks must realise they are oppressed as a group and must not yield to divisive secsure amployed against them.
 - (iii) Olock Power characterised by a feeling of non-colleboration with the approasive system, this coming out of a realisation for the Olock people's history and cultural heritage. Olockk Power projects on all or-nothing image.
