Councillor Manyane said that the open space opposite the Bar/Lounge and the Beer Garden is rocky and is not level. He considered that it should be levelled and be tarred to enable people patronising the Bar/Lounge and the beer garden to park their cars.

8. LODGERS' PERMITS

The following motion has been received from Councillor Thebehalo:

"That the Director Housing be requested that the children of the registered tenants be not compelled to take up lodgers permits and thereby forced to pay R1,00 per month per employed child."

The Director, Housing, reports:-

Single children living with their parents are not required to be in possession of lodgers permits. Married children living with their parents are classed as separate families and therefore required to have lodgers families.

The Senior Townships Manager said the Chief Director gave a ruling that married children living with parents who depend on them for support pay rent are issued with 'free' lodgers' permits.

Single children living with their parents are not required to be in possession of lodgers permits. Married children living with their parents are classed as separate families and therefore required to have lodgers permits. The R1,00 payment for a lodgers permit for each child arose from the ambiguity of the wording in the regulations. A man, his wife and minor children are issued with one lodgers permit for which they pay one rand.

Major children of a lodger are issued with individual lodgers permits and charged one rand a month.

Councillor Scwebu said that when a lodger is evicted by the registered occupier while his permit is still valid is required to pay again when he obtains a lodgers accommodation with another family.

10. HOUSING APPLICATIONS BY WIDOWS

The following motion has been received from Councillor Makhaya:

"Consideration of housing applications for wives whose husbands die before allocation - especially women with dependants.

It is common practice that women whose husbands died before allocation are not considered for accommodation.

This brings a lot of hardship to these women who at times are left with a lot of dependants.

In that case these mothers who were legally married and have applied for houses and who eventually become widows are forced to be lodgers with their young children in and out Soweto houses.

These mothers encounter quite a lot of difficulty in bringing up their children and as a result, juvenile delinquency.

These children are then exposed to bad companies - e.g. dagga smokers, Benzine smokers and dice players through lack of parental control and home discipline.

IT IS RECOMMENDED:

That the Chief Director, Housing, be requested to consider these applications."

The Senior Townships Manager said that where a man and his wife and children applied for a house and a man died before his family is allotted a house the application is transferred to the widow and the date of application remains the same. When a widow is due for a house an application for an authority to allocate house may be forwarded to the Bantu Affairs Commissioner in terms of Regulation 7(4) Chapter (2) of Notice 1036 of 1968.

The Senior Townships Manager said that a widow whose husband died while they were on a waiting list should be referred to the offices of the West Rand Administration Board at New Canada.

Councillor Scwebu said that although section 10(1)A or B of the Urban Areas Act does not differentiate between the sexes, women who have minor children and who qualify in terms of Section 10(1)A and(B) are told that they qualify for lodging accommodation only.

In reply to a further query re widows and children of Registered Tenant it was explained that Regulation 7(6) provides that a house may be allotted to a person after the death of the registered tenant on condition that person undertakes to live with the dependants of the deceased registered tenant.

RESOLVED TO RECOMMEND:

- (i) That the Chief Director be requested to arrange that on the death of an applicant the application be transferred to the widow and the date of application be made to coincide with that of her husband.
