Non-white Aux Nurse can be in charge of the a ward if the sister is off but not the senior white nurse if the Aux Nurse is present. Same offices but not toilets and rest-room. Working fine with the ~~non~~-white staff.

There are frictions between the staff - Report to Sister-in-Charge — to Matron. — — Co-operation amongst the White and Non-white staff. White nurses still on training give respect to qualified non-white nurses.

Nurse Council takes ^{A. Nurse} ~~the~~ as the superior to the trainees irrespective of colour.

The Aux. Nurse ~~can~~ can be in charge of a ward if the Sister is off ^{even if} ~~no matter~~ there is a white senior nurse, but we respect them (White nurses) and they respect us (non-white Aux. Nurses) Use the same office, different toilets and rest-rooms. Not allowed to work among the white patients

but they (white nurses) are allowed to work among non-white patients. Qualified Aux. Nurse has the right to instruct a white nurse but ~~not~~ the vice versa. White nurse aids and non-white nurse aids are on the same level as far as the nursing council is concerned but they think they senior 'cause they are white. White Nurse Aid can not instruct a non-white Aux. Nurse ~~cause~~ she is her senior.

Ambulance: - Non-white are allowed only to take white patients ^{only} on emergency cases, such as if the white drivers are out.

City Library: - Non-whites are not allowed to take or read books ~~in~~ in the city library.

Mr Kohli (Taxi-man)

Non-whites were allowed to hire white taxis but whites were not allowed to hire non-white taxis. Non-whites are no more allowed to hire white taxis. This has been stopped by the Govt. Any person (non-white) who needs a taxi while in town (surgery etc) has to phone for a non-white taxi in the station or phone Mr Damane and Mr Daniels, ~~who~~ have telephones in their homes. We a seniors to the trainees (white) -and they know that they are our juniors.

We use the same duty rooms but toilets are different and rest-rooms -different.

All buy food from the kitchen - 10c - a lunch.
When a non-white is working night duty is not allowed to eat supper in the hospital only whites are buying food at night.
